WELCOME TO YEAR 6

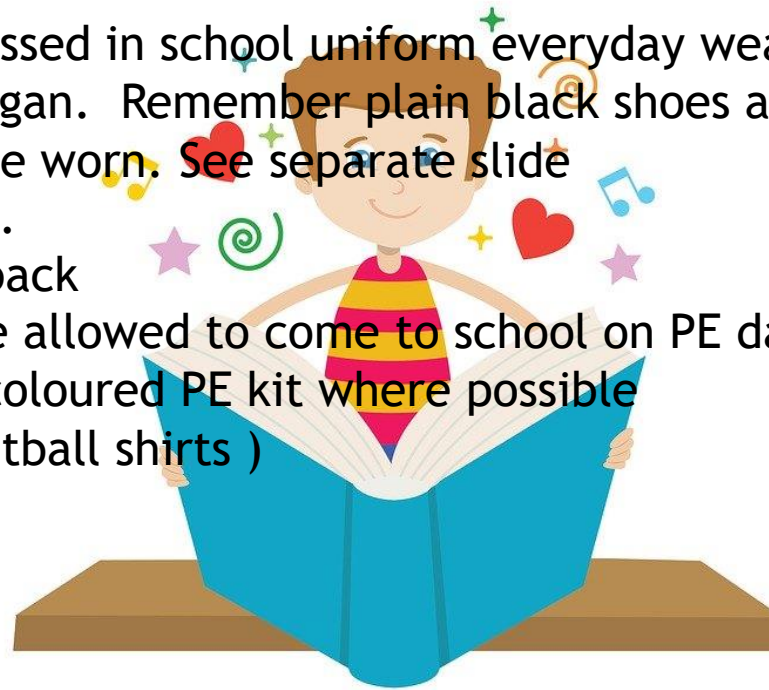
The aim of this short power point is to provide you with a guide to the expectations of Year 6 Sacred Heart pupils. This is so that your child is fully prepared to start in September.



EXPECTATIONS IN YEAR 6

At Sacred heart we pride ourselves in maintaining high expectations for our students and we appreciate your support with this too.

- Children should be dressed in school uniform everyday wearing a shirt and tie
- with a jumper or cardigan. Remember plain black shoes are a uniform requirement.
- Jewellery should not be worn. See separate slide
- No extreme hair styles.
- Long hair is best tied back
- PE kit- Children will be allowed to come to school on PE days wearing a suitable navy and white coloured PE kit where possible or dark coloured (No Football shirts)

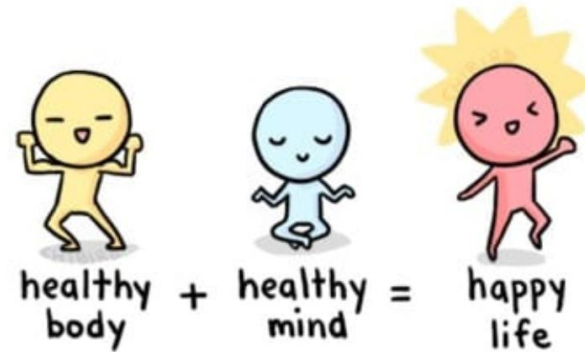

EXPECTATIONS IN YEAR 6

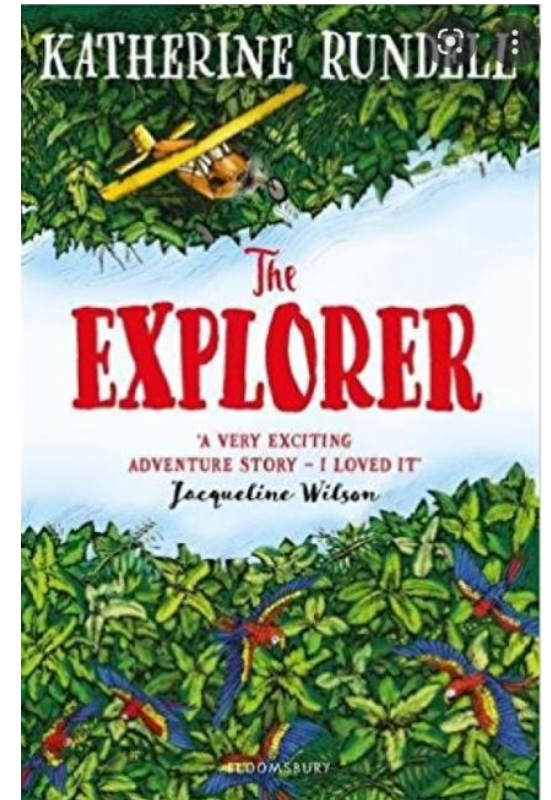
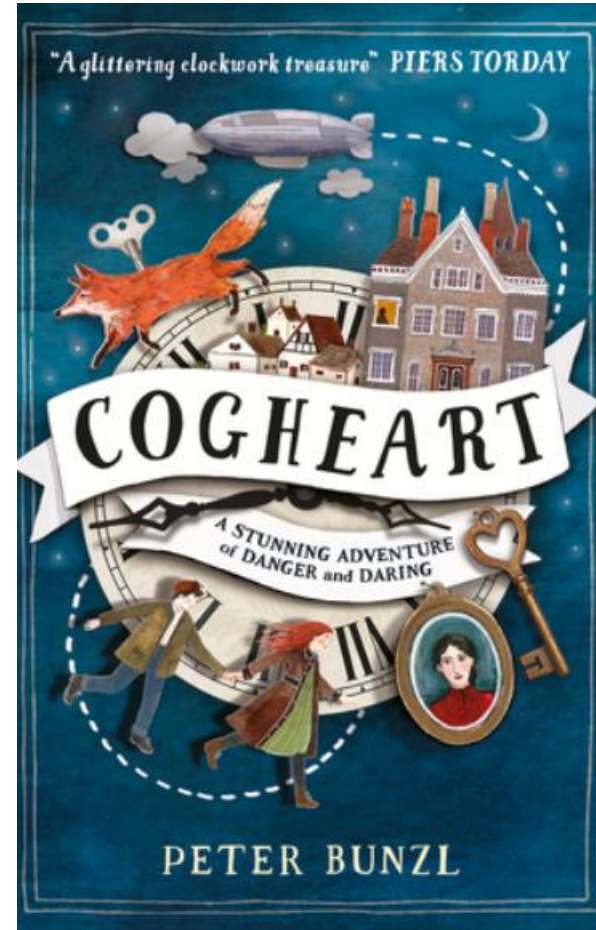
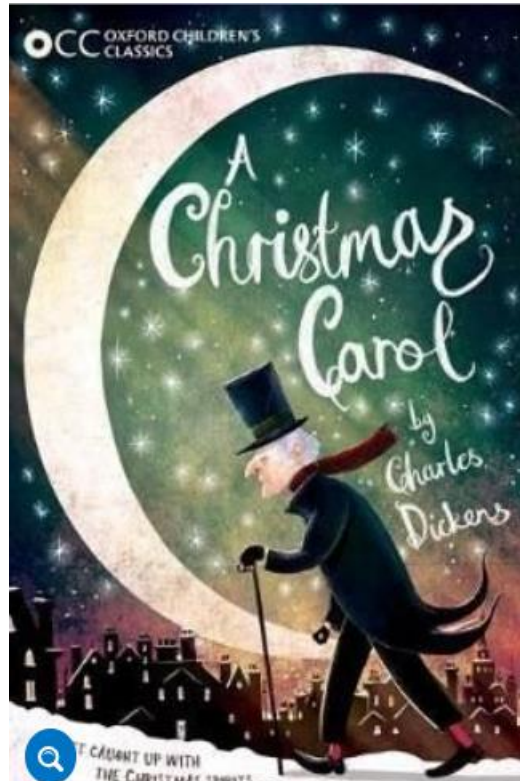
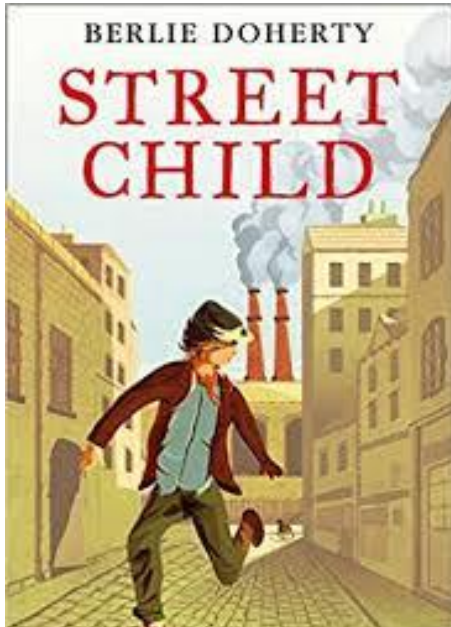
- ▶ As you already know , as parents , you are the primary educators of your children . You all play a very important role in the education of your children alongside us here at Sacred Heart.
- ▶ Year 6 will be a big jump for the children this year as they will need to be focused on learning in preparation for SAT's.
- ▶ Good behavior is paramount to effective teaching and learning so there will be high expectations of behaviour
- ▶ Please ensure you are encouraging your children to be independent as this will make more time for learning in school. They must ensure they have the correct equipment in school .
- ▶ Reading books should be in school every day and taken home every night. Children will be expected to read regularly and books signed off by parents.

Children will be heard read by Mrs Barnett and Miss Weston every week .

- ▶ We have a consistent approach across KS2 .
- ▶ Reading should be completed every night and recorded in reading record books.
- ▶ Times tables should be learnt by heart (by the end of year 4 all children should know by heart all tables up to 12X12) Times tables can be practiced using TTrock stars/ purple mash (children will have a login)
- ▶ Spellings may also be set (Children should know how to spell all Y5/Y6 statutory spellings by the end of Year 6). These will be tested in KS2 SAT's tests.
- ▶ Maths and English work will be set on a weekly basis . This may be written or online using Purple Mash/Google classroom

WHAT WILL LIFE BE LIKE IN YEAR 6 ?

We hope to work really hard in Year 6 but also have fun and enjoy coming to school. We have lots of fun topics which we will be learning about . We will be starting with our thematic curriculum topic of The rainforests, the Victorians and their incredible inventions and France . In art we will be learning about William Morris and Banksy , old and modern day artists.

In year 6 you will all be setting a super example to the rest of the school , having many jobs and responsibilities such as House Captains, Sports Captains, Faith Ambassadors and School Councillors etc
