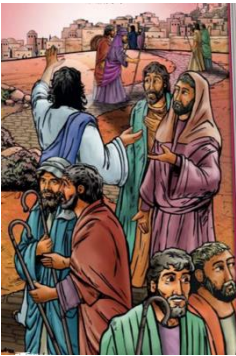
Dear Parents,

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus sends out his friends on an urgent mission with the instruction to heal and to share his message with all who will listen. Jesus wants us to listen closely to his words. Regularly listening to Jesus reminds us what's really important in life and how much we are loved by God. Listening is a sign of real love – it's a powerful way of showing that we care. Listening to the right people and the right messages is important for us and for our children.

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. 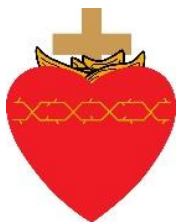
Postcard Project- Love One Another
